THOUGHTS FOR FEBRUARY

Have you ever heard the expression "thinking outside the box"? It would strike fear into lots of people as most of us would probably rather stay where we feel safe and know what's going on. This feeling is natural and human but sometimes events happen which force us to look again at things and try something new and challenging.

In Stalbridge and the surrounding villages there is a lot which is challenging for us at the start of 2018. The possibility of new building, the future of our surgery, the loss of retail businesses on the high street and that old chestnut Brexit to name just a few could make us feel very unsettled and nervous and we are right to be so.

Those who feel they belong to St. Mary's church family, (and by this we mean everyone who has any connection or love of the church and not just those who come up to the church to services), are having to re-assess how we worship God in the 21st century.

As we move into the last months before our priest goes into his well-deserved retirement we are looking at how we can offer what people want in the way of worship and community so that any future priest would be excited to come and be with us in rural North Dorset . All of these events will include music/singing, talking/praying together, activities and plenty of refreshments. Most of them will be in venues which are NOT the church building.

If <u>YOU</u> have any suggestions or ideas how these might appeal to <u>YOU</u> please let us know; all the contacts details are printed in this magazine. This new approach gives everyone who reads the magazine an opportunity to have a say or ask a question. Change is scary but it can be exciting too and being pro-active rather than reactive in this project as well as the other issues which are challenging Stalbridge and its neighbours might bring us all closer together. Our community is made up of people and each one is vital and important. We are lucky to live in such beautiful surroundings, let's thank God for that by accepting the challenges in front of us and working together for the good of everyone.

Ash Wednesday, 14th February



At 7pm in Stalbridge Parish Church, from across the parishes of the benefice, we are invited to worship together on this first day of Lent. The service will include hymns and an opportunity to receive the sign of the cross (the ash of last year's palm crosses) marked on the forehead as a sign of penitence and our mortality.

Thursdays in Lent in Spire Hill

On five Thursdays beginning on 22 February, there will be said services of Holy Communion at 10am in Stalbridge Parish Church, and at 6.30pm at Stourton Caundle Parish Church. At these services during Lent, there will be a short homily to help us prepare for the festival of resurrection. KINGS STAG NEWS

On 4th February at I Iam, there is Morning Worship in the memorial chapel that will reflect on the Word made flesh. As we hold our lives before God, may we know God's delight, receive God's love, and go about resourced to play our part in the world.



On 18th February at 11am in the memorial chapel, there is Holy Communion. We hear from the Gospel of Mark that the Spirit is at the heart of Jesus' baptism experience, and angels support him during testing times in the wilderness. They started by making cheese, progressing to strained or Greek Yoghurt, using 100 litres of milk to make 30 litres of Yoghurt. Advertising the product with 'Tastings' at farm shops etc, also in Dikes in Sept 2016. Then in London, March 2017 they entered the 'Virgin Food Entrepreneurs', also attending the 'Specialist and Fine Foods Festival' in London, gaining interest from 'Fortnum &

Mason'. Through the Internet they are able to supply establishments in London quickly, Daniel said Alex deals with that side of it (she's the internet wizard). He was obviously very passionate about his product, having to put a lot of hard work into producing and promoting it. Daniel left us with several different flavoured Yoghurts to sample, I liked the Honey one rather than the savoury flavours.

The 'Flower of the Month' was won by Wendy Bailey and June Harman. The competition for 'A Pretty or Unusual Milk Jug', 1st was Wendy, 2nd was June, and 3rd was Sheila Orchard.



Sunday (*Romans* 6.3-5)

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

Monday (Joel 2.12-14)

Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing. Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain-offering and a drink-offering for the Lord, your God?

Tuesday (1 Corinthians 9.24-27)

Friday (Matthew 6.1-4)

Jesus said to the disciples, 'Beware of practising your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.'

Saturday (*Luke 10.38-42*)

Jesus entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."
