#### A REFLECTION FOR MAY

Are you one of those who keeps everything or one of those who throws out the BVM on Friday having read it from cover to cover? Are your cupboards neat and well-ordered or does it take Herculean strength to force the doors together to contain years of stuff you haven't looked at since the last time you moved house?

At this time of year as the evenings draw out, the swallows return and the trees are coming into leaf again it seems a good time to take stock of life and more particularly all that clutter.

#### YOUR PERSONAL DATA

On 25<sup>th</sup> May 2018, the new General Data Protection Regulation comes into force across Europe, including the United Kingdom. Every organisation, including the Church of England and each parochial church council (PCC), must



have your permission if they are to hold any personal information about you. This may just be your name and address. You will be asked to sign a Consent Form that gives your permission for the PCC to hold information about you. You include on the form what information you are happy for the parochial church council to hold. It may be your address, telephone number and email address, if you have one. You decide what information will be given to the PCC. The PCC will tell you why it needs some information about you and how it will be used. For example, your PCC is grateful for donations you may make and its ability to reclaim tax you have already paid (20p for every £1 you donate). And your PCC would like to keep you informed about special events happening in the parish. Your information will never be passed on to anyone else by the PCC. You may withdraw your permission at any time in the future.

Your personal information is your own and your PCC respects and values your privacy.

Although we were disappointed at not seeing the Owls this was a very interesting, informative and amusing talk with some beautiful photography.



#### April Meeting

Chairman Tony Moore welcomed everyone to the meeting, gave out the notices and introduced this month's speaker who was David Moon.

Geoff Jeans informed us of Brian Spiller's progress and how the family hope to have him home soon, which is good news.

David Moon 's talk was on "The National Garden Scheme". He told us about the NGS and how it was formed in 1927, Edward Lutchens and Gertrude lekel's gardens were some of the first to open their garden under the scheme. Now over 4.000 gardens open to raise money for charities in the country. Over £50 million pounds have been raised, 3 million since 2016.

Many gardens are open throughout the year, from tiny courtyards, to three acres. Hestercombe, Great Dixter, the Garden on Holy Island, Heale House Gardens and Knoll Gardens are amongst the many that open, some are allotments. A popular garden is Mary Berry's. She is always there to show the public around as well as being a famous cook, and she is also a fantastic gardener. Her next door neighbour is Pauline Quirke who also opens her garden under the scheme.

David showed us many slides, of lovely gardens around the country, one of which being, Horatio's. This was a garden set up in memory of a young lad who worked at the Salisbury Spinal care unit, with many fantastic ideas he was beginning to implement. Whilst on an expedition to Greenland the group camp was attacked by a polar bear. His friends were badly hurt and Horatio sadly lost his life. His family, then set about fund raising to complete the garden he had started at the spinal unit, which is much admired and well used, by patients and public. There are plans for additional Horatio's Gardens at other hospital recovery units. One in Glasgow, designed by James Alexander Sinclair, one at Stoke Mandeville designed by Joe Swift, and one in Oswestry designed by Bunny Guinness. A sad but inspiring story.

This talk was fantastic, inspiring and rewarding with a beautiful visual display.

David finished with a little talk about his home town of Frome, were he is involved with the Frome in Bloom competition, Jenson Button the Formula One racing driver also has a helping hand. Michelle Howell

#### National Doughnut Week 12<sup>th</sup> – 19<sup>th</sup> May


Eat some doughnuts – and help raise money to help desperately ill children through the Children's Trust.

#### **Sunday** (John 7.37-39a)

On the last day of the festival, the great day, while Jesus was standing there, he cried out, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water." Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive.

#### **Monday** (Isaiah 40.28-31)

Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

#### Tuesday (1 Corinthians 12.4-7)

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

#### Wednesday (Joel 2.28,29)

I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions. Even on the male and female slaves, in those days, I will pour out my spirit.

#### **Thursday** (*Luke 11.9-13*)

Jesus said, 'Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who

knocks, the door will be opened. Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

#### Friday (2 Corinthians 1.20-22)

In Christ every one of God's promises is a 'Yes'. For this reason it is through him that we say the 'Amen', to the glory of God. But it is God who establishes us with you in Christ and has anointed us, by putting his seal on us and giving us his Spirit in our hearts as a first instalment.
