


Winner of Waterstones **Children's book prize** is local author David Solomons.

Stalbridge Community Library has been selected to be included in a “tool kit” issued by the Government to assist other libraries who may be considering the locally managed route-the same as us. We had a visit from two people from Dorset library service headquarters during February, to study the way we operate and to see if any lessons could be learned.
